- Mark Jesus came to <u>serve</u> and to give his life a <u>ransom</u> for many. Mark 10:45
- Luke Jesus came to seek and to save those who are lost. Luke 19:10
- John Jesus came that we may have <u>life</u>, and have it to the <u>full</u>. John 10:10






# WHO IS JESUS?

- He is the promised <u>Messiah</u>. Matthew 1
- He has the right <u>credentials</u>.
   <u>Legal</u> through Joseph. Matthew 1:1-17
   <u>Natural</u> through Mary. Luke 3:23-38
- He is fully <u>God</u> and fully <u>Man</u>. John 1:1-18

# Who Was Matthew?



- Matthew was a Jewish tax collector working for the <u>Romans</u>. Mt 9:9
- His toll booth was on the international highway, called the <u>Via</u> <u>Maris</u>, that ran right by Capernaum.
- He was probably the <u>richest</u> of the disciples.
- He <u>gave up</u> the most to become a disciple. Fishermen could have returned. He could not.
- He gave a <u>banquet</u> for Jesus. Matt. 9:10



- When was Matthew written? About <u>50 AD.</u>
  - <u>"To this day"</u> suggests it was sometime after Jesus had risen. (27:8, 28:15)
  - Before the destruction of Jerusalem in <u>70 AD</u> as temple was still standing. (24:15, 27:53)
- To whom was Matthew written? Jews
- What is Matthew's Emphasis?
  - The Kingdom of Heaven/God. 34 times
  - "Your King is coming to you" Mt. 21:5
  - Jesus <u>fulfills</u> OT prophecies of coming King.
    "fulfilled" 16 times: 1:22-23, 2:15, 2:17-18, 2:23, 4:14-16, 5:17, 8:17, 12:17-18, 13:14, 13:35, 21:4-5, 24:34, 26:54, 26:56, 27:9-10, 27:35

### What is the Kingdom of God?

- The <u>rule</u> of an eternal sovereign God over all creatures and things. Psalm 103:19, Daniel 4:3
- The sphere of salvation entered into at the <u>new birth</u>. John 3:5-7
- The Kingdom of God (<u>68x</u> in 10 NT books) and the Kingdom of Heaven (<u>32x</u> in Matt) are referring to the same thing.
- We are to pray, "Thy kingdom <u>come</u>".

# Who Was Mark?

- John (Jewish name) Mark (Latin name) is first mentioned in Acts 12:12.
- Mark was a nephew of <u>Barnabas</u>. Col.4:10
- His home was in Jerusalem. Acts 12:12, 13:13
- He may have been in Gethsemane. Mk 14:51
- He helped Paul and Barnabas (Acts 13:5) and then <u>defected</u> (13:13).
- Barnabas took him to Cyprus. Acts 15:36
- Later, worked with Paul. Philemon 24, II Tim. 4:11
- Worked with Peter in Rome. | Peter 5:13 "my son"
- <u>Peter</u> probably helped Mark write the Gospel.

## Who Was Luke?


- Luke was a medical doctor. Col 4:11-14
- He emphasizes Jesus' <u>healing</u> ministry. Luke 4:38-40, 5:15-25, 6:17-19, 7:11-25, 8:43-56, 9:1-11, 13:11-13, 14:2-4, 17:12-14, 22:50-51
- He was a close companion of <u>Paul</u>. Acts 16:10-17, 20:5-15, 21:1-18, 27:1-28:16
- He wrote both Luke and Acts to Theophilus from Rome while Paul was in prison, 60 62 AD.
- He was with Paul before he died. II Tim 4:11

# Who Was John ?

- John was a fisherman with brother James. Mt 4:21
- Jesus called them "Sons of Thunder." Mk 3:17
- He calls himself the disciple <u>"whom Jesus loved."</u>
  John 13:23, 19:26, 20:2, 21:7, 20
- He was an eye-witness of Christ's ministry. I Jn 1:1
- He is the only disciple mentioned at the cross. 19:26
- He became a pillar in the Jerusalem church. Gal. 2:9
- His later ministry was in <u>Ephesus</u> where he wrote his Gospel ca. 80-90 AD.
- He wrote Revelation while banished on <u>Patmos</u>.
- He died a <u>natural</u> death and is buried in Ephesus.
