THE WRITER OF ROMANS

- Saul of Tarsus, once a hater of Christ and the Church, now becomes a <u>lover</u> of both.
- He had the best credentials for what God called him to do:
 - He was born a Jew with Roman citizenship.
 - He grew up in Tarsus, home to one of the 3 finest <u>schools</u> in the Roman Empire.
 - He had the best training in the Old Testament under Gamaliel in Jerusalem. (Acts 22:3)

The Conversion and Early Journeys of Saul (Paul) of Tarsus c AD 34-45



- 1. Tarsus: Paul's hometown
- 2. Trained in Jerusalem
- 3. Converted near Damascus
- 4. God-taught 3 years in Arabia
- 5. Returned to Damascus
- 6. Went up to Jerusalem
- 7. Preached in Caesarea
- 8. Returned to Tarsus
- 9. Ministered in Cilicia
- 10. Pastored in Antioch till his missionary journeys.


Paul's 3rd Missionary Journey AD 53-58, Acts 18:23 – 21:17

Paul wrote Romans from Corinth in 56 AD



Why did Paul Write Romans?

- The Romans had built roads to Spain.
- Paul wanted to take the <u>Gospel</u> to Spain. (Romans 15:23-29)
- He needed a <u>base</u> of operations in Rome.
- He had never been to Rome, so this letter served as an introduction to the Roman church of him and the message he wanted to share.
- Unlike his other letters, Paul does not address any particular <u>problems</u>.




Paul wrote the Epistle to the Romans from Corinth



Corinth. The Temple of Aphrodite sits atop the Acrocorinth, 1,800 feet above the City. 1,000 prostitute priestesses served Corinth's citizens and sea-faring visitors. Paul wrote the letter to the Romans from here.







- Romans quotes the Old Testament <u>57</u> times.
- Key words in Romans:
 - God <u>154</u> times
 - Law <u>77</u> times
 - Christ <u>65</u> times
 - Sin <u>45</u> times
 - Lord <u>44</u> times
 - Righteousness (32) and Righteous (11) 43 times
 - Faith 40 times
 - Spirit (meaning the Holy Spirit) <u>29</u> times
 - Death <u>28</u> times -- Life <u>21</u> times
 - Grace 20 times (more than any other Bible book)

Romans 1:16-17

I am not ashamed of the gospel, because it is the power of God for the salvation of everyone who believes, first for the Jew, then for the Gentile.

For in the gospel a righteousness from God is revealed, a righteousness that is by faith from first to last, just as it is written:

"The righteous will live by faith."

• God sovereignly chose <u>Israel</u> 9:4-23

• God loves Gentiles too 9:24-33

• Salvation is offered to all 10:5 – 21

• God has not rejected Israel 11:1 – 10

• God is grafting Gentiles in 11:11 – 24

 God still has a redemptive <u>plan</u> for Israel 11:25 - 36 (God is not finished with Israel.)

GOD'S GLORY IS THE OBJECT OF SERVICE Romans 12 – 15:13

- A <u>living</u> sacrifice serves God and people 12:1-8
- A <u>sincere</u> love blesses people 12:9-21
- We are to <u>submit</u> to governing authorities 13:1-7
- Love your neighbor as yourself 13:8-10
- Wake up and live right till Jesus comes 13:11-14
- If strong: <u>lighten</u> up. If weak: <u>grow</u> up 14:1-15:13

- 5:8 "God demonstrates his own love for us in this, while we were still sinners, Christ died for us."
- 10:9-10 "If you confess with your mouth, 'Jesus is Lord,' and believe in your heart that God raised him from the dead, you will be saved. For it is with your heart that you believe and are justified, and it is with your mouth that you confess and are saved."
